THE SCHOOL: Archbishop Spalding is a Catholic, co-educational college preparatory high school, grades 9-12, operated under the auspices of the Archdiocese of Baltimore. Founded in 1966, it serves the needs of the growing population of the greater Annapolis and Baltimore area. Spalding requires course work that incorporates not only the core academic courses, but also embraces religious studies, fine arts, STEM education, the International Baccalaureate (IB) Diploma Program, and physical education. This reflects the school's dedication to provide an environment in which students are encouraged to reach their potential academically, spiritually, and physically.

ACCREDITATION: Spalding is accredited by the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools Council on Accreditation and School Improvement and by the AdvancED Accreditation Commission.

ADMISSIONS: Spalding accepts students with varying levels of ability and welcomes all applicants without regard for race, religion, national or ethnic origin. Transcripts, recommendations and the results of the Archdiocese of Baltimore admissions test are considered in the decision.
